Our story

In November 2014, Bishkek hosted the International Conference on Pasture Management during which the participants highlighted the importance of exchange of knowledge and experience on sustainable use of pasture lands. The Regional Pasture Knowledge Exchange Network, or Regional Pasture Network (RPN) for short was established to serve this need by providing a platform for such knowledge and experience sharing. It was supported in the framework of the regional programme of the Deutsche Gesellschaft für Internationale Zusammenarbeit (GIZ) GmbH (German federal enterprise for international cooperation) on Sustainable and Climate Sensitive Land Use for Economic Development in Central Asia.



Our objective

The RPN is a network to connect individuals and organizations in Central Asian countries, China and Mongolia to promote the exchange of experience and expertise in pasture management. Its thematic focus is on pasture management, but also includes aspects of forest and wildlife management. The exchange, in Russian and English languages, is conducted through provision a microsite, online library, Facebook page, monthly newsletter and organization of events, such as conferences and workshops, where members can meet each other in person.
